Grief Ministry

Commit to stay in touch for one year with a person, who has suffered a close familial loss. Regularity of contact would be determined by the person affected by the loss and you. Contact might include calls, notes, or visits.

Note & Card Writing Ministry

Once a month or less, you will write notes to assigned persons. Adults, youth, and children may contribute to this ministry.

Calling Ministry

You will call assigned persons to check in with them monthly or bi-monthly (determined by you). These people may be ill, shut-ins, or may be absent from church for several Sundays.

Meal Ministry

Occasionally a person or family may appreciate a meal during a difficult time. You would make or purchase a meal and deliver it.

WORSHIP ON WEDNESDAY - For ages birth - 5th Graders • Wednesdays 6 pm - 7:30 pm (during the school year)

Worship on Wednesday offers kids Christian fellowship and faith-building fun. Dinner starts at 6 pm in the Fellowship Hall, followed by K-5 worship and small groups upstairs; preschoolers meet in the Hamilton Nursery. Weekly registration (\$3/child) is required for meal planning.

FALL FAMILY FEST

A church-wide celebration with kid-friendly costumes, inflatables, face painting, balloon twisting, pumpkin painting, putt-putt, and games hosted by adult Sunday School classes. Free—no registration required.

ADVENT WORKSHOP

In preparation for the Advent season, families can create their own Advent wreath, decorate ornaments, and create other Advent crafts. There will also be light refreshments. *No registration is required for this FREE event.*

CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS MARKET

At our Children's Christmas Market, preschool and elementary kids can shop \$5 high-quality, wrapped gifts for family and friends while learning about fair trade and purposeful giving. Bring \$5 per gift—no registration required.

JOURNEY TO BETHLEHEM

Families with young children (and older people who are children at heart) are invited to attend this special GUMC tradition. Children will walk the path of Jesus' birth. After learning the reason we share gifts at Christmas, children will have a chance to share their wish list with the Jolly Ol' Guy himself. Registration is required for this free event.

EASTER EGG HUNT

Join us for our annual Easter Egg Hunt at McVay Gardens (behind the Owings Life Enrichment Center), featuring crafts, a petting zoo, train rides, photos, and a visit from the Easter Bunny! Free event; registration required.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Children who are four years old through children entering 6th grade are eligible to participate in VBS. If your child is younger than that age, we have a special Volunteer VBS just for them which is available (free of charge) to the children of volunteers. IGNITE 4TH AND 5TH GRADE RETREAT

4th and 5th graders travel to a local retreat facility for a one-night retreat with a focus on worship, fellowship, and team building. This retreat typically takes place in early February. Registration required.

This week of discovery leads children through a variety of mission opportunities. Children will work in inner-church missions, urban missions, and rural missions. This is a transforming week for children as they get a taste for different types of mission opportunities available and begin deciding where they feel most led to serve.

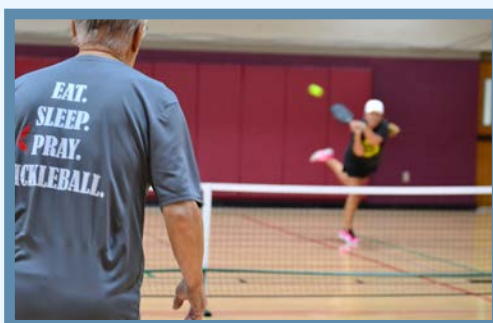

HOPE WORKS

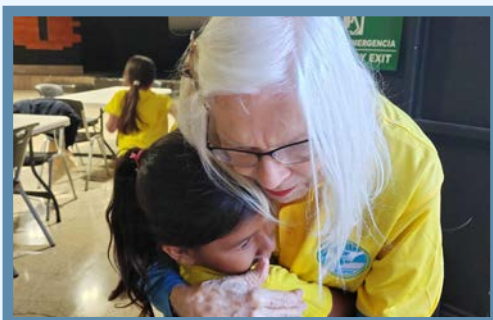
A ministry that provides hope in Jesus Christ and opportunities for sustainable work through education and lifelong services.

THE CHANCEL CHOIR

The Chancel Choir, our main traditional service ensemble, welcomes singers post-high school who wish to serve God through music. The choir leads worship weekly, performs seasonal events, Evensong services, and occasional major works with orchestra. Rehearsals are Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. (August–June) in the Choir Suite.

THE CONTEMPORARY PRISM RIOT PRAISE BAND

The Prism Riot Praise Band features singers and instrumentalists who lead music for Contemporary worship, blending hymns and current Christian songs with drums, bass, guitar, keyboards, and more.

TESTIMONY CHOIR

Testimony Choir offers youth (grades 6–12) a chance to serve through music and build fellowship. They rehearse Sundays at 5 p.m. (September–May) and regularly lead worship, with the Holy Thursday service as a yearly highlight.

MATINS HANDBELL CHOIR

Matins Handbell Choir is a group of skilled ringers that prepares music for worship and occasional concerts. They rehearse challenging pieces showcasing advanced handbell techniques. Rehearsals are Sundays at 6:15 p.m. (from the Sunday after Labor Day through mid to late May) in the Handbell Studio.

CHERUB CHOIR

The youngest, Cherub Choir, ages 3 - junior k focuses on pairing movement with song and discovering biblical stories told in music. Cherub Choir invites an adult (parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle) to stay in the room to participate alongside the child chorister. They meet for 45 minutes in room 136.

ALLELUIA CHOIR

The Alleluia Choir, 1-2 grades, incorporates movement and rhythm into their activities. This group also receives an introduction to healthy singing tone and participates regularly in our worship services. They meet for one hour in room 257.

HOSANNA CHOIR

The Hosanna Choir, 3-5 grades, is for our oldest children. An understanding of our hymns and hymnal, continued development of singing tone, and leadership in worship are part of Hosanna Choir activities. They meet for one hour in room 240, The Huddle. These choirs meet from the Sunday after Labor Day until early May.

WESLEY CHIMES

Wesley Chimes offers children in 2nd–5th grade a chance to make music through chime ringing and music instruction. They meet Wednesdays at 5:30 p.m. in the Handbell Studio for 30 minutes.
